



## What can high pressure cleaning do for you?

High pressure water cleaning can be used for many different cleaning needs. What are they?

You can buy a high pressure water cleaning machine and do it yourself, or you can hire a professional company with industrial grade machinery to do it for you. Often, the machinery that's used by high pressure cleaning companies is more effective. High pressure water cleaning is especially useful for:

- Graffiti removal - the water (especially warm water) dissolves paint faster and eliminates graffiti.
- Cleaning Driveways and Footpaths
- Building Facades
- Roofs
- Removal of gum from pavements
- Removal of oil stains or tyre marks from driveways
- Removal of sealants and oils from concrete
- Cleaning hard to reach weatherboards

When pressure and water is mixed to clean as well as remove dirt, grime and mold on outdoor surfaces, this is called high pressure cleaning. This method of cleaning is most commonly used to clean pebble-crete, concrete, sandstone, outdoor tiles, tennis courts, brick sand timber decking and tennis courts as well. There are numerous types of high pressure cleaners with the rate of each output are measured in PSI or pounds per square inch.

When you have decided to try out high pressure cleaning, you should first look at the latest water restrictions in your territory. Together with this, remove any debris or dirt in the area you plan to clean, as well as any furniture located near it. Try to avoid the running of the machine dry in order to enhance its durability as well as long-term performance.

When starting the machine, let a minute pass for the purpose of building pressure and then select your desired throttle level that will enable you to choose the most appropriate level for the surface you are to clean. A turbo attachment or a pressure gun requires slow and constant controlled movement for the purpose of eliminating the probability of missing dirt patches which can create streaky finishes. It is advisable not to use the pressure gun near the surfaces to avoid the removal of the concrete's topmost layer.
